ASSESSMENT UPDATE

During December and January our students take their mid year assessments. These include:

- MAP testing in reading and math for grades 2-5 (in January)
- FAST math assessment for grades K-5 (in January)
- FAST reading assessment for grades K-5 (in January)

The results for these assessments are used for diagnostic evaluations. This means that teachers may change their instruction and/or their interventions and supports in order to meet the needs of the students if necessary. We will <u>not</u> be sending any reports home, but if you would like to know more about how your child did on these assessments please contact your child's teacher.

AM SUPERVISION

We have adult supervision beginning at 8:40 AM in the multipurpose room for breakfast or the gym if students do not want breakfast. For safety reasons, please do not drop-off students prior to 8:40 AM.

CHROMEBOOK/NEXUS 7 TABLET INSURANCE

If you are interested in purchasing insurance for your child's devices, please see the office staff for further information. As we are using the tech devices more, we are getting more cracked screens and tech breaks. Many of these items can be covered under insurance if you purchase it.

DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

Due to colder temperatures please make sure your child is dressed appropriately to play outside every day. The students go out for lunch recess each day unless the temperature or wind chill is significantly cold. We want to make sure everyone is dressed warm with hats and gloves.

PERSONAL ITEMS AT SCHOOL

We ask that you keep your child's personal items such as toys, games, electronics and collector's cards at home. We have had an increase in students bringing these items to school and misplacing them. These items are only permitted by the request of a teacher for a special day in the classroom. Thank you!

DISTRICT REGISTRATION (NEW FAMILY & INCOMING K) NIGHT

Our evening Kindergarten Registration event will be held on Thursday, February 26th from 4:30-7:30pm at all of our District 59 elementary schools this event will kick off the registration for the upcoming school year. After this day, families may continue to come in to register between the hours of 9:30-11am and 1-3pm on days that schools are in session. To register a child for Kindergarten in the state of Illinois for the 2015/2016 school year the child must be 5 years old on or before September 1st, 2015 to start Kindergarten. Parents are required to bring the following documents to provide proof that they are a resident of School District 59: a certified original birth certificate. Parents will also need to prove residency. They will need to bring documents that show us that they live in our district such as: a current signed residence lease, a mortgage statement or a recent real estate tax bill & 2 other proofs of residency: a driver's license, utility bill, or a phone bill.

New Standards/New Curriculum

In January, the Holmes Cluster Elementary Math Resource teachers and students presented to Dr. Fessler and the Board of Education on the shift in math instruction. The changes reflect the district's continued work with 21st Century Learning Practices and the Common Core State Standards. Students had an opportunity to share how they use technology, manipulatives, and problem-solving on a regular basis to deepen their knowledge around math. The highlight of the evening was when the students engaged Dr. Fessler and the Board of Education in an interactive math activity. If you are interested in learning more about this shift, please ask your child's teacher or Mrs. Skorin, our math resource teacher. At each grade level, we are coming to a close with our first integrated unit of study. The integrated unit of study consisted of teaching literacy throughout the day within social studies content. Students had an opportunity to show what they learned through a summative writing task at the end. The teachers have learned a lot about being designers of curriculum as they planned and implemented this first unit. Their focus on going deeper and ensuring student understanding will continue within each and every unit. We are so proud of our students in their creativity, collaboration, communication and critical thinking skills within the new curriculum. They use their new technology devices to amplify their learning. They are teaching all of us new and innovative ways to express ideas. The classroom-learning environment is a place where we make mistakes, learn and grow together.

New Assessment-PARCC

In March, our students will take a new assessment called PARCC. This test is replacing the ISAT for our 3rd-5th grade students. We have been preparing in various ways for this new test such as developing a new curriculum and implementing instruction with a focus on 21st Century learning skills. Our teachers have also been helping our students become familiar with the new format of the test on the computers. SCHOOL SAFETY

As always, it is *imperative* to work together to make safety the "Number 1" priority on our school campus. Please read the following **drop-off and pick-up** guidelines carefully. <u>These must be strictly followed to insure the</u> <u>safety of everyone</u>.

The circle drive is for busses only during the hours of <u>8:40-9:25 AM and 3:20 PM-3:50 PM</u>.


	Kiss & Drive Procedures Absolutely no parking is allowed in the Kiss and Drive Drop Zone between <u>8:40 AM and 9:25 AM.</u>
	Only the first two vehicles are allowed to drop off children. Please use the small walkways (labeled below)
	Do not pull away from the Drop Zone until the front vehicles have pulled away.
	Never allow children to exit on the street side. In the winter, snow will be removed next to vehicles 1 and 2 for easy exiting.
•	Do not make U-Turns into neighboring driveways. It only takes a few extra moments to go around the block or go down to the Park district and turn around in their circle.
	For those of you not currently utilizing the Kiss and Drive Drop Zone, please keep in mind that the





Dear Parent or Guardian,

At the start of each calendar year teachers, parents, and students across Illinois have the opportunity to participate in the annual statewide Illinois 5Essentials Survey. This survey is designed to generate a detailed picture of the inner workings of your child's school. As a parent, this opportunity will allow you to share your thoughts on the important elements of school effectiveness in a survey about your child's school.

On behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois 5Essentials Survey will be administered online by UChicago Impact at the University of Chicago. The survey gathers data related to five indicators that can predict important student outcomes, including improved attendance and larger test score gains. These five indicators that affect and predict school success are:

- Effective Leaders
- Collaborative Teachers
- Involved Families
- Supportive Environments
- Ambitious Instruction

Prior research in more than 400 schools has shown that schools that were strong on at least three of these "5Essential" indicators were 10 times more likely to improve student learning gains in math and reading than those that were weak on three or more Essentials.

All teachers and 6th through 8th grade students will have an opportunity to participate in this survey. 5Essentials Reports will be generated for schools if their teachers and/or students meet the response rate threshold of 50 percent. These reports will be sent to schools and districts in May 2015 and will also be included in the State School Report Card.

Additionally, the district has chosen to provide the optional 5Essentials parent survey. If at least 20 percent of parents from each school complete this survey, a parent report will also be generated. The parent data will not be reported on the State Report Card.

Your participation in the parent portion of the survey will help us understand the conditions at your child's school and guide improvement. If you have children in more than one school, feel free to complete a survey for each school. Your identity and survey responses will be kept completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your child.

Students in grades 6 through 8 will take the 5Essentials survey during class time starting February 3, 2015. The Parent Survey can be taken anytime prior to March 13, 2015.


